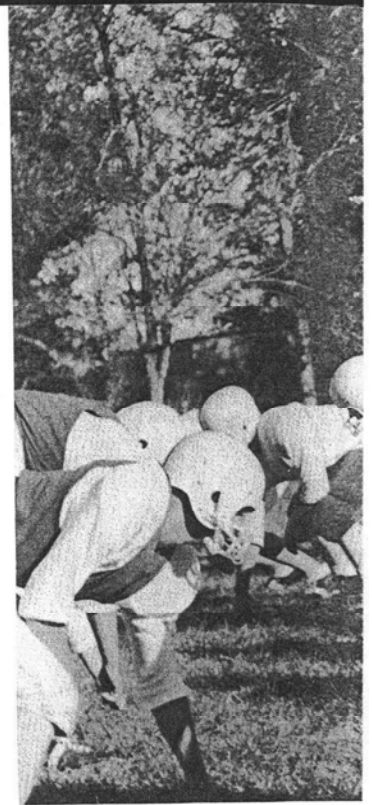


Just A Shoestring Away

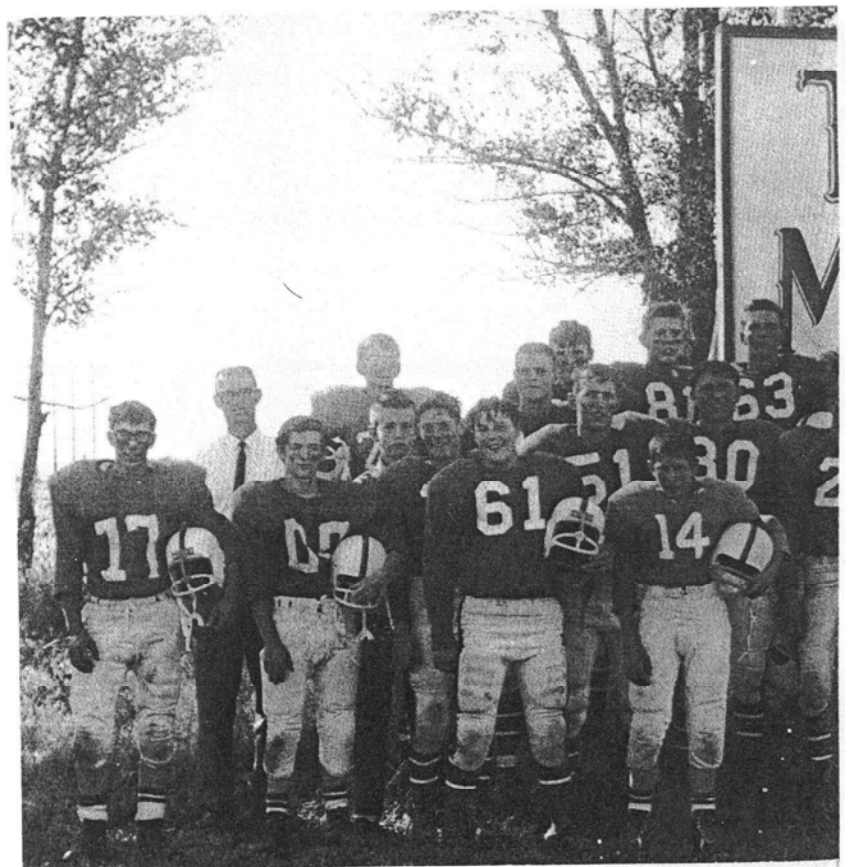

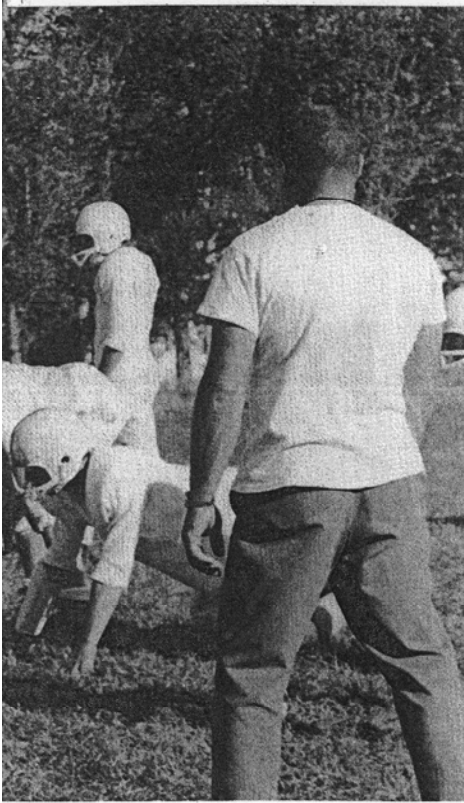

The Spartans played four home games on their new field this year.

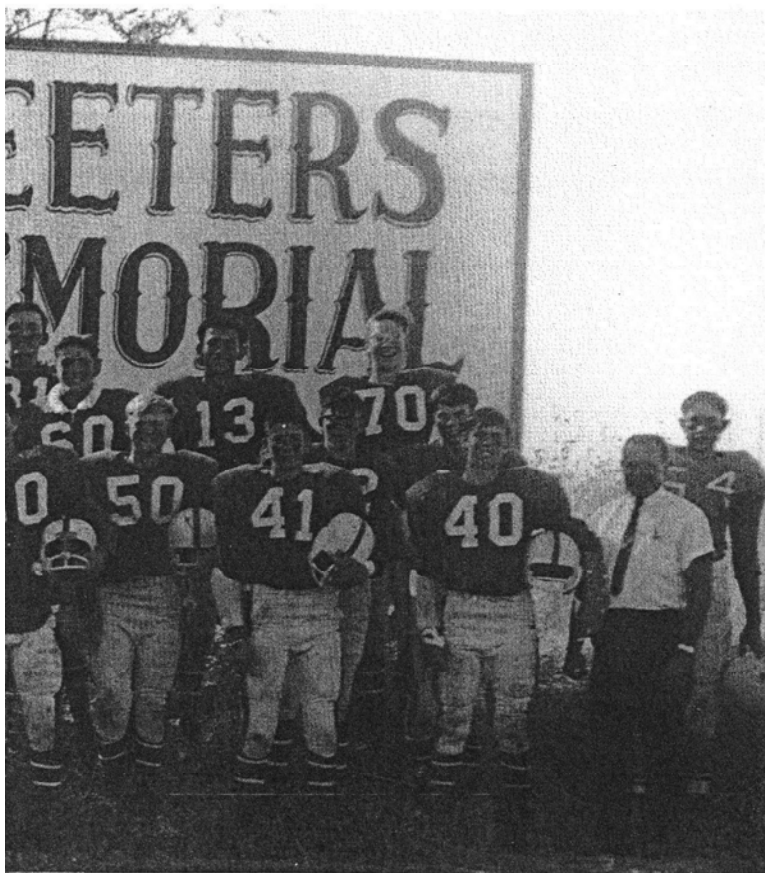
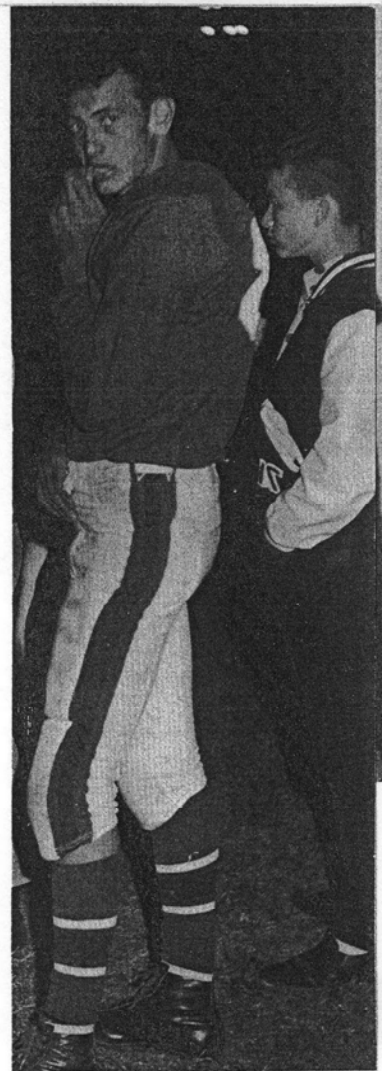
